## AARHUS

With the describing slogan of being the world's smallest big city, Aarhus is petite enough for one to be acquainted with the place in a short time, yet large enough to fill the days and nights with lively activities and events. The mixture of youthful optimism and creativity together with the city's good old-fashioned cosines creates a unique atmosphere making a visit to Aarhus a pleasant and uplifting experience.

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## THE CITY



Aarhus was founded by Vikings some 1300 years ago and has been an important trading city ever since. However, it was not until the 1900s that Aarhus really started growing and soon became Denmark's second largest city after the capital of Copenhagen.

Dubbed the cultural capital of Denmark, Aarhus has been on the forefront of defining Danish art and culture for years, which is also shown in the city's architecture and in the up-and-coming designer shops across Aarhus.

The relatively large influx of young people and students from across the Nordic countries creates a natural base for cultural activities and there are countless cafés as well as clubs, cinemas, museums, amusement parks and various other venues of entertainment.

Each year the town hosts several festivals and concerts including Aarhus International Jazz Festival in July and Aarhus Festuge in September - the biggest themed festival in Scandinavia.

### Beaches

The three most popular beaches in Aarhus are Bellevue, Den Permanente and Moesgård Strand which are all very popular on hot summer days but also fantastic for a nice walk with fresh air and beautiful sights. For Bellevue take bus 6, 12 or 16, for Moesgård Strand take bus 19, and for the old and characteristic bathing institution Den Permanente take any of these buses: 1, 6, 8, 9, 16, 56 or 58.





### **ARoS**

Aarhus' new museum of modern art has a notable collection of Danish art with a wide range of international exhibitions. A five metre tall sculpture named 'Boy' has quickly become the museums landmark.

### Shopping Malls

## ESSENTIAL INFORMATION

### Airport

Aarhus Airport is located 45 kilometres north of Aarhus and a regular bus service takes passengers from the airport to Aarhus bus station in 50 minutes for Dkr 85. The bus schedule is according to flight times. Taxis can also be found outside the main entrance and a ride to Aarhus will take you back around 550 DKK. Cars can also be rented at the airport from several companies. Pre-booking is advisable.

### Public Transport

Aarhus city centre is compact and it is easy to cover by foot. For longer trips, the city's bus network is extensive. Tickets can be purchased for Dkr 17 at the machine in the rear of the bus and last for two hours. An Aarhus Pass is well worth it if you are planning to do a lot of sightseeing in town. It costs 139 DKK for 24 hours, 169 DKK for 48 hours and covers unlimited travel and entrance to most museums as well as sight seeing tours. The latter needs to be booked at the tourist office. For more information on busses call +45 8940 1010. Also, bus drivers are usually more than happy to announce your stop if asked. Cycling is a great way to get around Aarhus and it's for free. More than 250 bikes are distributed around the city, which you can use just by dropping a 20 kroner deposit into a slot on the bike. For longer bike rides you can rent bicycles from:


